At the end James is going to conclude there faith (what we <u>say</u> we believe) and action (the <u>display</u> of what we actually believe) are <u>inseparable</u> in a Christian.

What we believe (faith) always comes out (works).

A claim without corresponding actions invalidates the claim.

Is the simple <u>recitation</u> of a prayer conversion?

So the claim of faith (<u>conversion</u>) without <u>works</u> is an empty claim.

Our life shows our beliefs

A person's faith is always on display

Abraham was <u>saved</u> by faith (he believed God). The <u>evidence</u> that he believed God was his willingness to <u>offer</u> Isaac.
